# PM Harper wants a 'Made in Canada' plan. This is how to get it!

(Ottawa) The Climate Action Network/Réseau Action Climat Canada (CAN-RAC) is beginning it's tour to find out what Canadians want in a Kyoto plan to address the climate crisis. "Climate Action Tour 2006", <a href="www.climatetour.ca">www.climatetour.ca</a>, will present a series of workshops across Canada for Canadians of all regions to design a climate action plan. The tour is part of the networks plan to get Canada back on the Kyoto track and re-emerge as the global good guy Canadians expect it to be.

The tour will not only be real with stops from coast to coast but virtual as well. Anyone who can't attend one of the sessions in person will be able to reveiw the record of each workshop on line and add there ideas to the discussion.

"We want to hear what Canadians want done so we can take their views to Ottawa", said John Bennett, executive director of the network, who will present the workshops. "With Enviornment Canada downgrading action on climate change, Stephen Harper's government creating a made in Canada plan and the Liberal leadership candidates annoucing their plans for action on climate change we feel this is a perfect opportunity to hear what the public wants to do about the climate crisis."

Each workshop will include background information about climate change, Canada's greenhouse gas emissions and existing climate change programs. Most of the time however will be devoted to gathering input from individual Canadians. A summary of recommendations from the sessions will be presented to the Prime Minister in the fall of this year.

The tour starts in Atlantic Canada on Wednesday September 13<sup>th</sup>, with stops in Truro and Wolfville and Halifax on the 14<sup>th</sup>. Throughout September dates include: Hamilton September 16th, Winnipeg September 18<sup>th</sup>, Victoria September 20<sup>th,</sup> Vancouver September 21<sup>st</sup>, Salt Spring Island September 22<sup>nd</sup>, Yellowknife September 25<sup>th,</sup> Edmonton September 26<sup>th,</sup> Calgary September 27<sup>th,</sup> Saskatoon September 28<sup>th,</sup> Midland September 30<sup>th.</sup> In October a number of cities will be added including Toronto, Regina, Fredericton, Comox, Waterloo and Haliburton.
